

2017-2018 Graduation Survey Data Summer and Fall (2017) and Spring (2018) Marshall University

Office of Academic Affairs:
Assessment and Quality Initiatives

- These data are for academic year 2017 2018. Unless otherwise noted, all findings are essentially unchanged since academic year 2016 – 2017.
- Overall response rate was 33% (558 respondents out of 1,678 graduates) down slightly from 37% in 2016-2017, but commensurate with 33% in 2015-2016.
- Females were more likely than males to respond to the survey.
- The Mean GPA of respondents (3.29) was significantly higher than that of all graduates (3.18).
- Response rates differed significantly across colleges. This was a change from most previous administrations.
- Respondents did not differ from the cohort in terms of race and age.

- Most respondents were single with no children, were WV residents, and completed their entire education at Marshall.
- Thirty-three percent reported no educational debt, while 10% reported debt greater than \$50,000 (we expanded the ceiling for debt this year; previously we had only asked about debt up to \$20,000).
- Most respondents stated that their educational objective was to begin their first career.
- Fifty-eight percent of respondents said they had participated in an internship or practicum (significantly up from 38% in 2016-2017, but commensurate with 56% in 2015-2016), with 66% believing this experience had helped them find employment (slightly down from 71% in 2016-2017, but up from 60% in 2015-2016).
- Sixty percent of respondents indicated that they intend to pursue graduate studies, while only 4% indicated that they intend to work for a Volunteer Organization such as the Peace Corps or AmeriCorps.
- Most students reported that they intend to remain in WV to complete graduate studies and most chose Marshall University for this purpose.

- Students reported positive feelings about all aspects of their MU education. On a scale of 1 5, with 1 being "strongly agree," 2 being "agree," 3 being "neither agree nor disagree," 4 being "disagree" and 5 being "strongly disagree," means exceeded 2 for only one out of sixteen items (down from two in 2016-2017 and from three in 2015-2016). This item also was identified in 2016-2017.
 - I broadened my appreciation for the arts. (2.19)
- However, we added an additional item in 2017-2018,
 - "Writing Intensive courses enhanced my learning experience," which received a mean of 2.11

- On a scale of 1 5, with 1 being "very satisfied," 2 being "satisfied," 3 being "neutral," 4 being "dissatisfied," and 5 being "very dissatisfied," students reported greater satisfaction with
 - the quality of teaching (1.74) than with
 - the quality of advising (2.21) improved over 2.37 in 2016-2017
 - academic support services (2.12)
 - classroom and lab facilities (2.10)
- Seventy-one percent (up from 67% in 2016-2017) of respondents plan to be employed in their major field, 10% not in their major field, and 19% were unsure at the time of the survey.
- Sixty-three percent (up from 59% in 2016-2017) plan to work in WV.
- Forty-eight percent (of the 404 students who answered the question) reported having accepted a job. Of those, 58% will earn more than \$30,000 annually (down from 73% in 2015-2016), with 21% earning more than \$50,000 annually.
- Only 20% of respondents reported using Career Services, with JobTrax and Resume Assistance used most frequently.




Population/Sample Demographic Comparisons: X^2 (1) = 14.657, p < .001





Response Rate by College














Population/Sample Demographic Comparisons: GPA; GPA is significant, t(557) = 5.607, p < .001.








During the last year of your studies, how many hours a week did you work while attending classes?


Which of the following best describes your educational objective while attending Marshall University.




Did you take part in an internship, practicum or other structured work experience related to your major?

If you answered "yes" to the previous question, did that experience increase your ability to secure employment?








Mean Agreement with Question 14 (1-17)


Frequencies for Question 14 (1 - 8)


Frequencies for Question 14 (9 - 16)


Mean Agreement with Question 15 (1-4)




Mean Satisfaction to Question 16 (1-4)



Frequencies for Question 16 (1 - 4)






If you plan to be employed after graduation, will your job be in the career path you have chosen?


If you plan to be employed after graduation, will your job be in your major field?






