The Communication Disorders department has a long-standing relationship with Community-Based learning. CD 370 L was an established course in which faculty and students work with local childcare centers to provide language stimulation activities for many years prior to becoming designated as a CBL course in Fall of 2013. The junior level CD students attend the childcare centers once a week to implement specifically planned language stimulation activities for two- and three-year-old classrooms. The current community partners are Playmates Child Care Center, Ebenezer Community Outreach Center and Trinity Academy and Daycare.

The students love the hands-on experience and being able to apply the content learned in previous Communication Disorder courses.
