

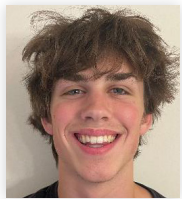


KUDOS FOR COLA

DR. ZELI RIVAS

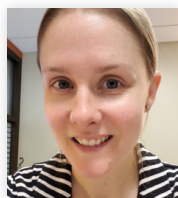
Dr. Zeli Rivas, professor of Japanese, was a finalist for the West Virginia Teacher of the Year award, sponsored by the Faculty Merit Foundation of West Virginia. Dr. Rivas' work with students in Modern Languages, as her work in global education at Marshall, earned her recognition as one of the best university professors in the state.



DR. LAURA MICHELE DIENER

The **Hedrick Outstanding Faculty Award** went to **Dr. Laura Michele Diener**, History associate professor, for her innovating teaching in ancient and medieval history. The award rewards outstanding work in the classroom and in research.

Dr. Andrew Morelock, assistant professor of Political Science, and **Dr. Julie Snyder-Yuly**, assistant professor of Communication Studies, earned two of three **Pickens-Queen Teacher awards**. The Pickens-Queen award recognizes junior faculty members who exemplify outstanding teaching.

Dr. Meghan Hancock, assistant professor of English, was named the **Hedrick Faculty Teaching Fellow** for 2024-2025. Hedrick Fellows create a teaching/learning project, lead a faculty learning community, and train faculty members to assign and assess high-impact practices.

In 1972 **William J. Maier** established the Maier Writing Awards program to encourage and reward excellent writing for students at all levels, including in the first-year composition course. In 1979, Mr. Maier established the Maier Latin Cup award program to honor his high school Latin teacher and encourage the study of Latin. BILL DODSON

Bill Dodson was honored with the College of Liberal Arts Award of Distinction for 2024 at the annual Alumni Awards banquet. Bill earned a BA in Sociology from Marshall University in 1973 and an MPA from Ohio State. While at Marshall he worked to establish a Black Student Center and the Black United Students group.

He worked with community organizations while at Marshall, including the Special Olympics, Jaycees, and Kiwanis. After graduation he worked in personnel and affirmative action, promoting jobs for veterans and underprivileged youth. Throughout his career, he advanced community action, housing initiatives, and community block grant projects around Columbus, OH. Bill's community service also includes service on the boards of a dozen community service agencies.

Bill was instrumental in founding Rhema Christian Center, where he has served as VP and executive Director of the Dayspring Christian Community Development Corporation for the past 30 years.

Bill Dodson exemplifies the values of the College of Liberal Arts. His influence and advocacy have left an imprint on his family, his profession, his community, and his church.
