Candidates for Mayor of Huntington and Governor of West Virginia Answered Questions From Audience Members at a Candidate Forum Held at Marshall University

HUNTINGTON, W.Va. - Members of the community and Marshall University students, faculty, and staff gathered for a Candidate Forum in the Encova Auditorium of the Brad D. Smith Center for Business and Innovation last night. West Virginia gubernatorial candidates Steve Williams (D) and S. Marshall Wilson (Constitution Party) as well as Huntington mayoral candidates Jennifer Wheeler (D), Jay Michaels (I), and Patrick Farrell (R) answered questions submitted by audience members live during the event.

The Candidate Forum was also livestreamed. The recording is available at <u>marshall.edu/livestream</u>. This event was part of Marshall University's Voter Friendly Campus initiative. Marshall is the only Voter Friendly Campus in the state of West Virginia.

The forum was moderated by League of Women Voters of the Huntington Area Co-President Martha Woodward along with Student Moderator Quinlin Sollars and emceed by John Deaver Drinko Academy Executive Director Dr. Montserrat Miller.

There are now less than 28 days until the general election. West Virginians can still register to vote through Oct. 15. Early voting begins Oct. 23, and Cabell County residents can vote early at the Drinko Library on campus at Marshall. "This Candidate Forum was timely, informative, and a model of civil discourse," said Dr. Miller.

Gubernatorial candidates Attorney General Patrick Morrisey (R), Erika Kolenich (L), and Chase Linko-Looper (Mountain Party) were invited to participate but did not attend the event.
