### MAJOR INFORMATION

- The total number of free electives required depends on the number of hours completed in STA (150 or 150B) and ENG (101 or 101P) and the number of hours that can be double-counted toward multiple degree requirements.
- Student must earn a grade of "C" or better in all ACC prerequisite courses (including ACC 215 and ACC 216).
- The ACC Elective can be any 300/400 level ACC course (except ACC 310 or ACC 490), or LE 308, or an approved graduate course (GPA requirement exists).
- ACC 499 is the capstone course for all Accounting majors. It can only be taken during the senior year after all prerequisites are met.
- The International Business Elective can be met by taking one of the following courses: ECN 408, 420, 421, 460, FIN 440, MGT 445, or MKT 371.
