MAJOR INFORMATION

- The total number of free electives required depends on the number of hours The International Business Elective can be met by taking one of the completed in STA (150 or 150B) and ENG (101 or 101P) and the number of hours that can be double-counted toward multiple degree requirements.
- MGT electives can be any 300 or 400 level MGT courses not already required (except MGT 490 Internship).
- The Health Care Practicum is completed during the summer of the senior year.
- MGT 455 is the capstone course for all Health Care Management majors. It can only be taken during the senior year after all prerequisites are met.
- Multicultural or International additional university requirement met with International Business Elective.
- following courses: ECN 408, 420, 421, 460, FIN 440, MGT 445, or MKT 371. MGT 445 cannot count as both the International Business Elective and a MGT elective.
